Ash Wednesday

It will be necessary to book if you wish to attend Mass on Ash Wednesday.

Ashes will be not be administered in the usual way. They will be administered in silence and the priest will **sprinkle the blessed** ashes on to the top of your head. The priest will come round the church and bring the ashes to you.

Update on Safety Measures at St Michael

A meeting was recently held by Fr Mark to review the safety measures at St Michaels. The following is a summary of the actions agreed.

Ventilation In order to ensure adequate ventilation the porch doors, glass doors and fire exit doors need to be opened 30 mins before mass. The use of the extractor fans has been reviewed and when Mass starts the fire exit doors and one each of the porch and glass doors can be closed and the fan turned on.

Pews All pews need to be distanced to 1 metre plus, per the bishop's guidelines. Section D where the majority of the movement is, will be re measured. The current tape is going to be removed and replaced with Do Not Enter signs to ensure the pews look more orderly.

When the distribution of communion during Mass recommences, the front pews will not be used, as an additional precaution, and as the space allows this in St Michaels.

Movement Additional signage in the hall area and on the railings is going to be put up to encourage social distancing in the hall and remind of the need to maintain this in the body of the church.

When communion distribution resumes during Mass, the celebrant will announce the need to maintain social distancing and this will also be noted on the bulletin. In addition, the use of an appropriate place to consume the host is being investigated.
