HALLOWEEN AND ALL SAINTS The shops are now full of Halloween trinkets. It is important to remember that Halloween is originally the name of a Christian festival. As November approached and the days grew shorter and all the vegetation died down for the winter, people naturally thought of death. The great feast of All Saints was celebrated on the first day of November to remember all those who had shown that Christian faith overcomes the power of death. Mediaeval Christians had a real sense of fun and therefore created all sorts of games and rituals to poke fun at death to show that it had NO POWER over CHRIST. I was in a 15th Century crypt in Sicily last recently and there were skulls painted round all the walls and all the skulls had ridiculous expressions on their faces, the whole thing was designed to make you laugh! On the eve of All Hallows (All Saints) the idea of Halloween traditions were to make fun of everything that made claim to have power over us, confident in the victory of CHRIST. In recent decades some people, losing this focus, turned Halloween into an anti-Christian celebration. It does not have to be so. It is fine for families to have some fun, as long as for them it is an expression of the victory of Christ. The best way to ensure this, is that in our families we make even more fuss of All Saints Day itself with a big family meal and celebration. Children could be encouraged to dress up as their favourite saints for example. Did you know there are particular foods associated with different saints? You can check this out on Catholic websites like aleteia.org All Saints Day is an opportunity to be creative and celebrate.
