## Parish News and Activities

Annual SVP Mass for the Sick will take place on Saturday 4<sup>th</sup> September at Midday. This Mass is an opportunity to gather those who are infirm and housebound to come together to receive the Sacrament of the Sick. *If you know of anyone who would benefit from being brought to this Mass*, please inform any member of the SVP or the parish clergy. *If you are able to offer transport to this Mass for someone*, please also inform the SVP or the parish clergy. *Please be aware that the Church teaches that the Sacrament of the Sick is reserved for those who are seriously ill or suffering from the frailty of old age. It is not intended for anybody who feels under the weather. Before the Mass begins please ensure that the priests know who is to be anointed with the Sacrament.* 

<u>National Altar Servers Mass at SS Mary & John Wolverhampton</u> We are very privileged to have this National Event celebrated by the Archbishop here in Wolverhampton this year! <u>Proximity</u> On Saturday 2nd October 2021, the diocese is holding a new event for Altar Servers called "Proximity" They intend this to be an annual event for altar servers of all ages. The aim is to form servers in faith as those who come close to Jesus at the altar, so that they may grow closer to him in their lives. This year, our day is based around the life and witness of recently-beatified teenager Blessed Carlo Acutis. Hosted in the inspirational setting of St. Mary's College, Oscott, our diocesan seminary, the day involves:

- an exploration of the life of Blessed Carlo, led by Mgr. Mark Crisp,
- Mass with the seminary community,
- testimonies from those for whom altar serving has been part of their vocational journey,
- age-appropriate workshops for junior, senior and adult servers,
- concluding with Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament.

The day is also a wonderful opportunity to meet other servers from across the Archdiocese of Birmingham and find out about other opportunities to grow in faith. They are asking for a donation of just £5.00 to attend (subsidised by the diocese). The day will be led by the Diocesan Vocations Office (which administers the Guild in the Archdiocese of Birmingham) and the Kenelm Youth Trust, with contributions from the Oscott seminary community. <u>Lateral Flow Test Kits</u> Using one of these kits is very easy and it is a reasonably reliable way of knowing whether you have contracted Covid 19. <u>Praying the Rosary</u> Following on from the success of the online Rosary led by the Knights of St Columba during May, the Rosary will now be led by different groups of the parish on the First Thursday of Every Month at 8.00pm. At first this will still be online, but once restrictions are relaxed, it will also be public.

The annual diocesan Thanksgiving Mass for Marriage will take place on Saturday 9th October, 12noon at St Chad's Cathedral. If you are celebrating a milestone anniversary during 2021 (from your 1st up to 60th (every 5 years), and every year over 60) please email Lianne Pap (Marriage and Family Life Co-ordinator) marriage.mass@rcaob.org.uk for your names to be listed in the Mass booklet. <u>Celebrations for our new our new Parish Patron Blessed Carlo Acutis</u> Blesses Carlo was beatified last year in Assisi on October 10<sup>th</sup> and his new feast day was instituted for October 12<sup>th</sup> each year. We may have been the first parish in the world to be dedicated to Blessed Carlo but unfortunately due to the Covid Restrictions, we were not able to mark this in anyway when the news originally reached us in January. We therefore intend to have a variety of events across our three churches around his new Feast Day. Archbishop Bernard will be joining us on Sunday 10<sup>th</sup> October for one of these special events. At present we are thinking of ideas of how to mark this occasion. ## Guidelines for Attendance at Mass

YOU NO LONGER NEED TO BOOK TO COME TO MASS. Each church has lists of names of those who have been attending and you will be ticked off the list when you arrive.

- If you are coming back to church for the first time, when you arrive, you will be asked to either register with the QR code or write your name and phone number on a slip of paper and place it in the box provided.
- When you arrive, you will be asked to wear a face mask in church (unless you are exempt), and you will be asked to sanitise your hands on entry.
- A steward will ask you if you wish to be socially distanced or not, and they will take you to the relevant area. In the socially
  distanced area, please fill from the front so that there are no gaps left in the pews that would mean someone would have
  to climb past you in the row.
- Members of the congregation are now permitted to sing if they are wearing a face mask.
- Readers no longer have to sanitise before they read but they can continue to do so if they wish.
- Stewards, Eucharistic Ministers and Servers will continue to wear face masks.
- Holy Communion is distributed differently in each church so please check the information sheet for your church. People in
  the non-socially distanced areas will be able to process up to Holy communion in the normal way but please wait for a
  steward to call out your row so that there is no bunching together in the communion procession.
- Sanitiser will still be offered as you go up to Holy Communion, but this is totally voluntary, and is provided in case you
  sense that your hands may need cleaning after touching benches and handrails. Please ensure you have rubbed your
  hands together well, so that they are dry before you receive the Blessed Sacrament. Please also ensure that you stretch
  out your hand as flat as possible.
- At the end of Mass, you may stay behind to pray but please be conscious of others in your row who may want to leave. (Particularly if there is no other way out of the pew.)
- As you are leaving, please also ensure that you do not congregate within the church but go straight outside.

Let us keep on praying for one another and for those who are sick and those who care for them during this pandemic.
