I tested negative on Monday morning and Wednesday morning of this week and was negative both times, so the visits I did at the beginning of the week should be ok. Unfortunately, however, after feeling slightly ill on Thursday evening I took a test on Friday Morning which was positive. I then went for a PCR which confirmed this. I do not feel very ill but I have to self-isolate until December 27th and will not see any of you at Christmas.
