## Walking together - the Synodal Path

<u>Walking Together</u> is a special time of prayer, listening, dialogue and recommendations. We will all have the chance to respond to the request of the Pope to dream about the Church we are called to be. In the new year there will be opportunities to come together in various ways to discuss a number of questions around the three key concepts that shape 'walking together': *Communion, Participation and Mission*. By reflecting and engaging in dialogue with each other on these and other questions, which we will share in full over the next few weeks, and by asking the Holy Spirit to grant us his wisdom and grace to help us to weigh up what is important to God, we will discern the path we are called to walk together. As a parish, we will submit our responses to these questions to Archbishop Bernard by the end of March 2022, who will, in turn, submit a 10-page document to the Bishops Conference of England and Wales in June next year. Submissions from around the world will then ultimately feed into the Synod in Rome planned for Oct 2023.

<u>How do I prepare myself for the parish meetings that happen after Christmas?</u> During Advent the diocese have provided questions to help you reflect on the three areas: Communion, Participation and Mission This week we look at *Communion:* 

- 1. In what ways does the Catholic Church enhance your life?
- 2. Which of your concerns does the Church fail or struggle to respond to?
- 3. How is the Church perceived by members of your family, your friends and work colleagues?
- 4. How might the Church improve its decision-making processes?
- 5. The last two years has been challenging. In your experience, how has your faith been supported? How would you like your faith to be supported in the future?

This Helpline also offers a confidential listening ear to anyone who is worried about a pregnancy related issue, or who has experienced loss of a pregnancy.

<u>Crisp-packet recycling.</u> This scheme suggested by our young people at St Michael's has returned: notices will remind you to sanitise if you touch the bin with your hands, as you do with other items at church. Most people bring packets which have had a few days' "rest" at home to help mitigate any risk attached to them of spreading disease: thank you for your thoughtfulness.

All donations (particularly those of UNWRAPPED toys, selection boxes and hot water bottles) are greatly appreciated. A huge thank you to 'The Homeless Period Wolverhampton' Charity for their donation of feminine hygiene products which have been shared between 4 city primary schools.
