<u>WALKING TOGETHER</u> After each Mass this Sunday, there will be an invitation to come along to our Parish Listening Meetings which will be held in each church over the next few weeks.

On Saturday $\mathbf{22}^{nd}$ January, we will look at $\mathbf{Communion}$, 3.00 pm - 4.30 pm at all three churches.

on Saturday 5th February we will look at Participation, 3.00pm - 4.30pm at all three churches.

and on **Saturday 5th March** we will look at **Mission.** 3.00pm - 4.30pm at all three churches.

Here are the areas of discussion for each meeting:

Saturday 22nd January Communion,

- 1. In what ways does the Catholic Church enhance your life?
- 2. Which of your concerns does the Church fail or struggle to respond to?
- 3. How is the Church perceived by members of your family, your friends and work colleagues?
- 4. How might the Church improve its decision-making processes?
- 5. The last two years has been challenging. In your experience, how has your faith been supported? How would you like your faith to be supported in the future?

Saturday 5th February Participation

- 6. How do you believe your presence at Mass makes a difference?
- 7. Explain what difference does it make in your life to receive the sacraments?
- 8. What part does prayer play in your life and your relationship with God/The church?
- 9. How do you currently participate, personally, in the life of the Church? How do families and young people participate in the life of the Church? How much responsibility do you have as an individual?
- 10. How can we better enable full participation and co-responsibility in the life of the Church at the parish and diocesan levels?
- 11. If you could describe your local parish fulfilling your dreams and concerns for the whole world and the local community, what would it be like?

Saturday 5th March Mission

- 12. How does your experience of parish life allow you to reflect, develop, action, and speak about your faith?
- 13. In what ways is the call of Jesus to serve the poor a priority in the Church and especially in our parishes?
- 14. What more can we do in our parishes to address the needs of the poor (homeless, lonely, the bereaved, prisoner, the sick, people with addictions, refugees, people with disabilities, those suffer in developing countries)?

This weekend is PEACE SUNDAY and this year Pope Francis asks us to think about 'Education, work and dialogue between generations: tools for building lasting peace'. The need for peace in the world is obvious. People are struggling against violence and conflict, growing inequalities, the effects of climate change and the covid pandemic. How can we harness the gifts and energy of all generations in the work of peace making? Which 'tools for building lasting peace' do you think Pope Francis might be talking about? In this country we have an active Catholic peace movement in **Pax**Christi, which does a great deal of good work to promote peace and nonviolence through parishes, schools and social media. Their website suggests many ways we can all become better peacemakers.
