As the Archdiocese has now informed us to send in our feedback by the end of February, we have had to move our third meeting from March to February.

So, the next two meetings will be:

**Saturday 5<sup>th</sup> February** when we will look at **Participation**, 3.00pm - 4.30pm at all three churches. and **Saturday 19<sup>th</sup> February** when we will look at **Mission**. 3.00pm - 4.30pm at all three churches. Here are the areas of discussion for each meeting:

#### Saturday 5th February Participation

- 6. How do you believe your presence at Mass makes a difference?
- 7. Explain what difference does it make in your life to receive the sacraments?
- 8. What part does prayer play in your life and your relationship with God/The church?
- 9. How do you currently participate, personally, in the life of the Church? How do families and young people participate in the life of the Church? How much responsibility do you have as an individual?
- 10. How can we better enable full participation and co-responsibility in the life of the Church at the parish and diocesan levels?
- 11. If you could describe your local parish fulfilling your dreams and concerns for the whole world and the local community, what would it be like?

#### Saturday 19th February Mission

- 12. How does your experience of parish life allow you to reflect, develop, action, and speak about your faith?
- 13. In what ways is the call of Jesus to serve the poor a priority in the Church and especially in our parishes?
- 14. What more can we do in our parishes to address the needs of the poor (homeless, lonely, the bereaved, prisoner, the sick, people with addictions, refugees, people with disabilities, those suffer in developing countries)?

<u>Period Poverty</u>. The Catholic Women's League (CWL) entreat you to support Period Poverty by donating ladies' sanitary items and toiletries. There is a basket in the entrance of St Michael's Church for these donations which will be collected each week. All donations received will support families through the Food Collection service in our parish. The CWL thank you for your continuing support.

<u>Crisp-Packet Recycling.</u> This scheme suggested by our young people at St Michael's has returned: notices will remind you to sanitise if you touch the bin with your hands, as you do with other items at church. Most people bring packets which have had a few days' "rest" at home to help mitigate any risk attached to them of spreading disease: thank you for your thoughtfulness.
