# Walking together - the Synodal Path

<u>WALKING TOGETHER</u> is a special time of prayer, listening, dialogue and recommendations. You can find out more online at <a href="https://www.birminghamdiocese.org.uk/the-synod-2021-2023">https://www.birminghamdiocese.org.uk/the-synod-2021-2023</a>We will all have the chance to respond to the request of the Pope to dream about the Church we are called to be. There will special meetings for us to listen to people' reflections on the three concepts that shape 'walking together'.

On Saturday 22<sup>nd</sup> January, we will look at Communion,

on Saturday 5th February we will look at Participation,

and on Saturday 5th March we will look at Mission.

The Listening Meetings will be at **3.00pm and last till 4.30pm.** On each Saturday there will three meetings running simultaneously. One at SS Peter & Paul in the Milner Room, one in St Michael's Hall and one in St Bernadette's Hall. Here are the areas of discussion for each meeting:

#### Communion.

- 1. In what ways does the Catholic Church enhance your life?
- 2. Which of your concerns does the Church fail or struggle to respond to?
- 3. How is the Church perceived by members of your family, your friends and work colleagues?
- 4. How might the Church improve its decision-making processes?
- 5. The last two years has been challenging. In your experience, how has your faith been supported? How would you like your faith to be supported in the future?

#### **Participation**

- 6. How do you believe your presence at Mass makes a difference?
- 7. Explain what difference does it make in your life to receive the sacraments?
- 8. What part does prayer play in your life and your relationship with God/The church?
- 9. How do you currently participate, personally, in the life of the Church? How do families and young people participate in the life of the Church? How much responsibility do you have as an individual?
- 10. How can we better enable full participation and co-responsibility in the life of the Church at the parish and diocesan levels?
- 11. If you could describe your local parish fulfilling your dreams and concerns for the whole world and the local community, what would it be like?

#### Mission

- 12. How does your experience of parish life allow you to reflect, develop, action, and speak about your faith?
- 13. In what ways is the call of Jesus to serve the poor a priority in the Church and especially in our parishes?
- 14. What more can we do in our parishes to address the needs of the poor (homeless, lonely, the bereaved, prisoner, the sick, people with addictions, refugees, people with disabilities, those suffer in developing countries .....)?

<u>Further revisions to Covid-19 testing and self-isolation rules</u>: Under the new guidance, anyone from next Tuesday (11<sup>th</sup> January) in England who receives a positive lateral flow device (LFD) test result should report their result to NHS Test and Trace and must self-isolate immediately, but will not need to take a follow-up PCR test.

After reporting a positive LFD test result, they will be contacted by NHS Test and Trace so that their contacts can be traced.

Anyone who tests positive will be able to leave self-isolation seven days after the date of their initial positive test if they receive two negative lateral flow test results, 24 hours apart, on days six and seven.
