<u>Deanery Prayer Service to begin the Synodal Path</u> The dream of the Holy Father is that of the Church as the pilgrim People of God journeying together, listening firstly to God and to one another. In the address he gave to the faithful of Rome he highlighted the importance of 'mutual listening' and that this will be at the heart of the synodal process throughout the Church and beyond the boundaries of the Church. In his meeting with the Council of Cardinals on 22nd September, Pope Francis continued his reflection on the process by saying that the Synodal process is not about a specific theme, but "a way of living the Church marked at all levels by mutual listening and a pastoral attitude" Between Christmas and Easter we will be having some parish meetings where people can share their experiences. To begin this time of prayer and reflection we are having a Deanery wide prayer service at **St Joseph's on the Willenhall Road on Sunday 28th November**. See the notice in the porch. All are welcome.

Adoration at St Michael's next Saturday at 10.30am will also be offered for the success of the Synodal Path meetings.

Finances

Affect of the pandemic on the Offertory Collection the total offertory income across the parish in 2020 was £25,173.65 down on the previous year! It looks as though 2021 will be a similar figure. This is due to the lower numbers attending Mass. As you can imagine, the overheads for our three churches and halls remain the same as usual. The income from our halls is beginning to pick up but we are not back to pre-pandemic levels yet. We will need to look at different ways of improving our income as we come out of the pandemic, but one easy way to increase what we already receive is GIFT AID. About half of our offertory income across the three churches is *not gift aided*. If it were, it would greatly increase our income. Remember, if you are a taxpayer and you gift aid your offertory donations, you do not give any more yourself, but the government tops up your payments, so that the parish gains more income. If you would like to start using GIFT AID, speak to one the priests, Sr Lydwin or Hazel Burdon.
