Deanery Launch of the Synodal Path

There will be a special Service of Prayer and Praise this Sunday 28th November at 5.00pm where we can gather with others from our deanery as we begin this Synodal path together. It is at **St Joseph's on the Willenhall Road**See the notice in the porch. All are welcome!

Advent and Launch of the Synodal Path – "Walking Together"

Today we begin Advent, and we also begin our spiritual journey of joining with the Catholic Church around the world in what is called the Synodal Path. What does this mean? Well, Pope Francis wants to hear from the whole Church about what is happening in local parishes. He and Archbishop Bernard Longley would like to know what individuals think we should all be doing to improve the life of our parishes. By the end of our time together we aim to capture your answers to the basic question: What is the Holy Spirit saying to our Church today? The way he has proposed doing this is a synodal process. Synod means 'journeying together' and it involves listening to the Holy Spirit and to each other to discern the path we are called to walk together. This weekend we will say this special prayer together at the end of Mass and we are encouraged to pray it every day during this time of spiritual reflection over the next few months.

Adsumus, Sancte Spiritus

We stand before You, Holy Spirit, as we gather together in Your name.

With You alone to guide us, make Yourself at home in our hearts;

Teach us the way we must go and how we are to pursue it.

We are weak and sinful; do not let us promote disorder.

Do not let ignorance lead us down the wrong path nor partiality influence our actions.

Let us find in You our unity so that we may journey together to eternal life and not stray from the way of truth and what is right.

All this we ask of You, who are at work in every place and time, in the communion of the Father and the Son, forever and ever. Amen

<u>How do I find out more?</u> In recent weeks, the diocese has held a number of online information sessions, attended by over 200 people, to help explain how this process will work in practice. All of these presentations and other key documents are available on the website at https://www.birminghamdiocese.org.uk/the-synod-2021-2023 We will also be publishing more information on the bulletin each week. There will be various "listening events" organised in the parish after Christmas, along with other activities in already existing parish groups.

We will have a short meeting before Christmas to look at the guide that has been prepared to help kickstart conversations, so that we are ready to go in January. In the meantime, please pray that the Holy Spirit will lead and guide us over the months ahead.

<u>Confessions in Advent</u> A great way to make a new start in life during Advent is to go to confession. Remember Confessions are available at St Bernadette's after Mass on Fridays, at St Michael's on Saturday mornings at 11.00 am and for Advent we are putting on *extra Confessions at SS Peter & Paul* on Sunday mornings before Mass from 9.45 am.

Rorate Mass (candlelit) On Saturday Morning, December 4th 7.30 am in the Lady Chapel at SS Peter & Paul. This is an opportunity for quiet meditation with Our Lady to enter more deeply into the meaning of the Advent season. All Welcome!

Bambinelli Blessing on Gaudete Sunday This year we can once again return to the tradition started by Pope Francis a few years ago for children (and adults) to bring their infant Jesus figures from their cribs to be blessed at the end of Mass on the Third Sunday of Advent 12th December.
