The Prayer and Life Workshops (PLW) help you learn and deepen in the art of prayer through participating in a weekly workshop. Through the PLW, this learning has a highly experimental character: by praying we learn to pray. In each PLW workshop we learn to enter into a personal relationship with the Lord through different prayer methods, from the very first steps using very simple prayer methods, to the heights of contemplative prayer by the end. This Sunday, 17<sup>th</sup> October, prayer guides from PLW will be speaking at the end of Mass to share their testimony and invite you to participate in this incredible ministry. The following Saturday (23<sup>rd</sup> October) there will be a taster session at St Michael's Church; allowing those of you who would like to deepen your life of prayer and your relationship with the Lord to see if the workshops are for you.

Pope Francis has formally opened the Synod on the Synodal Pathway in Rome (9/10 October) with dioceses across the world following this weekend (16/17 October). A Mass to mark the Opening of the Synodal Pathway in the Archdiocese of Birmingham will take place at St Chad's Cathedral on Sunday 17 October, celebrated by Archbishop Bernard Longley. All are welcome to join via the Cathedral live stream. This weekend at all our Masses we will listen to a Pastoral Letter from the Archbishop to mark the occasion, which will call upon us all to play our part in the Synod. The Food Collection: continues at the usual times: St Bernadette at all Masses; SS Peter & Paul at the 10.15 Sunday Mass; St Michael at all Masses AND Tuesday 1-2 and Saturday 10-11. > We would be extremely grateful for additional donations of HOT WATER BOTTLES, HOT WATER BOTTLE COVERS (This is a very simple knitting pattern, but any will do! Using 5mm needles and Chunky or 2 balls of DK wool together: cast on 40 stitches, knit 28cm using any stitch, cast off 10 stitches at the beginning of the next 2 rows, rib 7cm on the remaining 20 stitches, cast off loosely, knit 2 pieces and sew together leaving a gap at the opening of the bottle) and MICROWAVABLE HEAT PADS as winter approaches. This week's donations have been distributed to local families via a free 'pop up' shop at SS Mary & John Catholic Primary Academy. Thank you for your continued support.

<u>Novena to St John Paul II</u> 14th-22nd October The Second Reading in parliament of the Assisted Dying Bill will take place on Friday 22<sup>nd</sup> October, which is the Feast Day of St John Paul II. There will be a national novena seeking the intercession of St John Paul II. 'Jesu's told his disciples to pray at all times and not lose heart. Providentially the discussion of Baroness Meacher's Bill in the House of Lords falls on the feast of St John Paul II on 22nd October. The novena, asking the intercession of St. John Paul II, who spoke courageously about the infinite worth of each human person and witnessed to the cross in his final illness, calls upon Catholics and all who share our view that assisted suicide is wrong, to pray with perseverance that this Bill will be defeated. St. John Paul II, pray for us.'
