The Food Collection: Many thanks to St Paul's C of E Primary School for sharing their Harvest Festival produce with us. We would be extremely grateful for donations of HOT WATER BOTTLES, HOT WATER BOTTLE COVERS (this is a very simple knitting pattern but any will do! Using 5mm needles and Chunky or 2 balls of DK wool together: cast on 40 stitches, knit 28cm using any stitch, cast off 10 stitches at the beginning of the next 2 rows, rib 7cm on the remaining 20 stitches, cast off loosely, knit 2 pieces and sew together leaving a gap at the opening of the bottle) and MICROWAVABLE HEAT PADS as winter approaches. This week's donations have been distributed to local families via a free 'pop up' shop at Warstones Primary School. Thank you for your continued support.
