Zoom Advent Feast If you have not already been able to celebrate the Advent feast, I will be leading one by Zoom on Saturday 19th December at 7.00pm. All you need is to download the booklet from the *Advent and Christmas*Resources page of the website. You will need 7 candles and you need to prepare four saucer size dishes which will contain some olives, pistachios, some vinegar and, in the last dish a tiny drop of olive oil with some cotton wool or paper tissues. You will then need a glass and a drink of your choice and have your meal prepared, ready to eat when we get to the end of the rituals (which take half an hour). A Chance to Reconcile with the Lord before Christmas? There will be Adoration and Confessions available across the city on Monday December 21st from 6.30 pm – 8.00pm in the following Churches: St. Michael's St. Anthony's, St. Thomas of Canterbury, St. Joseph's (Wolverhampton), Our Lady's Ss. Mary & John's (Snow Hill), & St. Patrick's. See the poster in the porch or on the website for more details. There will be three priests at St Michael's. There will also be Confessions at the usual time on Saturdays at St Michael's and an extra session at SS Peter & Paul on December 17th.

<u>Virtual Crib Festival 2020:</u> Please consider adding a touch to your door and window displays this Advent which signals our Christian hope. Across Penn, across denominations, we invite you to be part of a Virtual Crib Festival, to spread a little light and joy to our world through our windows etc. Share the message of the Nativity particularly across the weekend of Gaudete Sunday (Dec 11- 14): light up a crib, create a reflection in pink (liturgical colour that Sunday), doodle "Joy" in lights: any response to a small or major part of the Nativity. Do spread this good news - and the request to join in - across and beyond our parishes. (CWL is encouraging this local initiative nationally: can you?)

This is an initiative from Churches together in Penn, but we can all participate across the whole of our parish.

<u>Doorstep Carols:</u> share the good news in traditional fashion. Dec 16th at 6pm: join in singing from your own steps and gardens to spread a little joy. Radio stations across the land will broadcast the same carols to keep us all in time. If you are willing to inform your street/ face book friends check the website for "Street organisers" (there is a flyer just to alert neighbours, primarily). Some people have expressed that they would be embarrassed to sing at their doorstep so some of us will gather socially distanced on the lawn at St Michael's Church instead. Bring a lantern!

The Catholic Bishops of England and Wales have issued this important guidance concerning the new vaccines against the coronavirus.

The development of a vaccine against COVID-19 presents an important breakthrough in protecting others as well as oneself from the virus; a virus which has not only caused a global pandemic and led to a huge loss of life but has also placed a great burden on healthcare workers and systems.

Each of us has a duty to protect others from infection with its danger of serious illness, and for some, death. A vaccine is the most effective way to achieve this unless one decides to self-isolate. At present, debate concerns the use of the vaccines developed by Pfizer & BioNTech, Moderna, and AstraZeneca.

Some have questioned the use of the Astra Zeneca vaccine since it has been developed from cell-lines originating from the cells of an aborted foetus in 1983. The Congregation for the Doctrine of the Faith and the Pontifical Academy of Life have expressed the view that one may in good conscience and for a grave reason receive a vaccine sourced in this way, provided that there is a sufficient moral distance between the present administration of the vaccine and the original wrongful action.

In the COVID-19 pandemic, we judge that this grave reason exists and that one does not sin by receiving the vaccine. Both the Pfizer & BioNTech and Moderna vaccines have a different source since they are mRNA-based vaccines. On 2 December 2020, the Pfizer & BioNTech vaccine was approved for use in the UK. Each Catholic must educate his or her conscience on this matter and decide what to do, also bearing in mind that a vaccine must be safe, effective, and universally available, especially to the poor of the world.

Catholics may in good conscience receive any of these vaccines for the good of others and themselves. In good conscience, one may refuse a particular vaccine but continues to have a duty to protect others from infection.
